NOTICE OF RACE

1 ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

The Organizing Authority (OA) will be Oakcliff Sailing.

2 VENUE

The venue will be Oyster Bay, New York, USA.

3 EVENT GRADING

The event has applied for World Sailing (WS) Grade 4. This grading is subject to review by World Sailing. The event may be re-graded when there is clear reason to do so.

4 PROVISIONAL PROGRAMME

- a) Race office open from Thursday, July 19 at 0900.
- b) Registration on Thursday from 0900 to 1700 and must be completed before going sailing.
- c) Clinic days will be July 19 – 20 0900 to 1600.
- d) Racing days will be July 21 - 22.
- e) First attention signal on each racing day will be at 1000.
- f) First meeting with umpires will be on Saturday, July 21 at 0900.
- g) Mandatory Competitors' Briefing each racing day at 0900
- h) The latest time for an attention signal on the last day of racing will be 1600.
- i) Weigh in ONLY can be completed by 0900, Saturday, July 21
- j) Prize giving will follow racing on the last day as soon as feasible.

4.2 Unless excused by the OA, attendance at the following is mandatory:

- (a) Initial briefing for skippers.
- (b) Daily briefing, for skippers.
- (c) Prize giving for the final skippers and crews.

5 SKIPPERS ELIGIBILITY

- (a) Up to ten skippers will be invited. Only skippers invited by the OA will be eligible to enter this event.
- (b) The registered skipper shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency.
- (c) To remain eligible a skipper shall confirm acceptance of the invitation by completing the invitation process at the web address indicated on the invitation email.
- (d) A non-refundable entry bond of US \$250 shall accompany the acceptance of the invitation for this to be valid.
- (e) All competitors shall meet the eligibility requirements of World Sailing regulation 19.2.

- (f) All competitors shall obtain a WS Sailor ID by registering online at www.sailing.org/isafsailor. Skippers shall inform the OA of their WS Sailor ID at registration.

6 ENTRIES

- 6.1 The skipper shall be entered on completion of registration, crew weighing and the payment of all fees and deposits. Payment can be made by credit card or cash in US funds.
- 6.2 A non-refundable entry fee of US \$500, which includes the entry bond, shall be paid by registration.
- 6.3 When a skipper accepts an invitation and later withdraws within two months of the event or leaves the event before the end without written approval from the OA, a zero score may be applied by World Sailing to their Ranking Points for that event. World Sailing Regulation 27.2.
- 6.4 Damage deposit
- (a) An initial damage deposit of US\$2,500 shall be paid at registration, unless extended by the OA. This deposit is the maximum payable by the skipper as a result of any one incident. The damage deposit may be paid by credit card.
- (b) If a deduction from the damage deposit is decided by the OA, it will require that the deposit be restored to its original amount before the skipper will be permitted to continue in the event.
- (c) Any remaining deposit after the event will be refunded within 30 days of event completion.

7 RULES

- 7.1 (a) The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the RRS and including Appendix C.
(b) The rules for the handling of boats will apply, and will also apply to any practice sailing and sponsor races.
(c) The US SAILING prescriptions to RRS 67 and 76.1 will be the only US prescriptions that will apply and their text will be posted on the official notice board.
- 7.2 Alterations to the RRS.
- a) Add to RRS 41: (e) help to recover from the water and return on board a crew member, provided the return on board is at the approximate location of the recovery.
- b) RRS C8.6, C7.4, C6.3, 28.1, 31, 60.1(b), 62.1(a), 63.1 and A5 will be changed in the sailing instructions.

8 BOATS AND SAILS

- (a) The event will be sailed in Match 40 type boats.
- (b) Eight to ten boats will be provided.
- (c) The following sails will be provided for each boat: Mainsail, Genoa, Jib and Spinnaker.
- (d) Each skipper should provide a VHF radio for his/her team. Oakcliff has some VHF's that can be borrowed (the damage deposit will be charged for non-return).
- (e) Each competitor is responsible for providing their own PFD. Oakcliff has some PFD's that can be borrowed (the damage deposit will be charged for non-return of, or damage to, borrowed PFDs).
- (f) Boats will be allocated by draw, either daily or for each round as decided by the Race Committee.

9 CREW (INCLUDING SKIPPER)

- (a) The number of crew (including the skipper) shall be five or six. All registered crew shall sail all races.
- (b) When a registered skipper is unable to continue in the event, the Chief Umpire may authorize an original crew member to substitute.
- (c) The total weight of the crew, including the skipper, dressed in at least shorts and shirts, shall not exceed 962.5 lbs., determined at the time of registration or such time as required by the RC.
- (d) When a registered crew member is unable to continue in the event, the Chief Umpire may authorize a substitute, a temporary substitute or other adjustment.

10 EVENT FORMAT

- (a) The event will consist of the following stages:
- Stage 1 - Single Round Robin
 - Stage 2 - Quarter Finals
 - Stage 3 - Semi Final
 - Stage 4 - Petit Final
 - Stage 5 - Finals
 - Stage 6 - Consolation Round
- (b) The RC may change the format, terminate any stage or the event when, in its opinion, it is impractical to attempt to hold the remainder of matches under the existing conditions or in the remaining time scheduled. Early stages may be terminated in favor of later stages

11 COURSE

- (a) The course will be windward/leeward with starboard roundings, finishing downwind.
- (b) The intended course area will be Oyster Bay or Cold Spring Harbor.

12 ADVERTISING

- (a) As boats and equipment will be supplied by the OA, WS regulation 20.4 applies. Each boat will be required to display advertising as supplied by the OA.
- (b) Competitors may be permitted to display advertising ashore at the venue, but this is subject to individual negotiation with the O A.
- (c) Boats will not be permitted the right to protest for breaches of any rules regarding advertising. This (amends RRS 60.1(a)).

13 PRIZES

There will be Oakcliff prizes for the top three teams.

The top finisher not already qualified will earn an invitation to the Oakcliff Halloween Grade 3

14 MEDIA, IMAGES AND SOUND

The OA shall have the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of any charge.

15 COACH BOATS

The OA will provide boats from which coaches may observe racing and communicate with their teams between matches. Individual coach boats will not be permitted.

16 DISCLAIMER

All those taking any part in the event do so at their own risk. The OA, its associates and appointees accept no responsibility for any loss, damage, injury or inconvenience incurred, however so caused.

17 INVITATIONS

Entries will only be accepted from invited skippers. If you wish to be invited please return the Request for Invitation form or complete the online request at
